In the Midland Community School District, the following revenue purpose statement, which specifies the use of funds from the penny sales and services tax for schools shall be adopted: Any revenue the Midland Community School District may receive from the penny sales and services tax for schools will be expended for any statutorily authorized purpose for school infrastructure, property tax relief, and/or the issuance of bonds as authorized now or hereafter by Chapter 423E and Chapter 423F of the lowa Code. "School infrastructure" is defined by law to include the construction, reconstruction, repair, demolition work, purchasing or remodeling of schoolhouses, stadiums, gyms, fieldhouses, and bus garages and the procurement of schoolhouse construction sites, the making of site improvements as authorized now or hereafter by the lowa Code, and those equipment, transportation equipment, and public recreation and other activities for which revenues under lowa Code sections 298.3 or 300.2 may be spent as authorized now or hereafter by the lowa Code.
